<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Be able to elicit patients understanding of CKD and where needed offer the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Explain the risk factors affecting the progression of CKD including but not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Cardiovascular disease ● Hypertension ● Diabetes ● Smoking ● Chronic use of Non Steroidal Anti Inflammatory Drugs (NSAIDS) ● Untreated urinary outflow obstruction¹²¹ ▪ How can people cope with and adjust to CKD and what sources of psychological support are available²¹²² ○ Provide patients with health promotion advice, taking into account their ethnicity, cultural, social and economic needs, including but not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Exercise ▪ Achieving a healthy weight ▪ Smoking cessation¹²³ ○ Be able to explain the type and frequency of the monitoring needed ¹²⁴ ○ Be able to explain the steps to take prior to monitoring to ensure accurate results¹²⁵: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Not to eat meat 12 hours prior to serum test for creatinine or Urine albumin/creatinine ratio (ACR) ▪ Urine ACR should ideally be performed on an early morning urine ● Review: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Be able to perform the tests necessary to review CKD classification including:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Serum Creatinine test ▪ Urine ACR ▪ eGFR ○ Be able to assess patient for risk factors affecting the progression of CKD¹²⁶: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Performing blood pressure (BP) review ▪ Investigating for diabetes ▪ Smoking status and providing cessation advice where appropriate ▪ Chronic use of NSAIDs ▪ Any issues with urinary flow ○ Be able to administer appropriate vaccinations to patients with CKD as per local and national guidance¹²⁷ ○ Be able to address any issues around frailty/frailty syndrome that may impact on their renal health¹²⁸ ○ Be able to identify where patient requires onward specialist referral and make referral in conjunction with a suitable senior clinician¹²⁹ ○ Be able to recognise when patient complexity exceeds competence and refer on as appropriate
